

# Targeted Support Offer

Through adventure and play we aim to make a positive difference to children and young people through promoting their personal development, building positive relationships and raising aspirations.

With a highly skilled Playwork Team, superb facilities and the support of the local community we provide a context where children can grow and develop physically, mentally and socially.

The Playground is for children and families between the ages of 8 and 13 years but other younger and older children may attend up to the age of 17 years. Children under 8 years **must** be accompanied by a responsible adult over the age of 18 years.

We recognise the importance of effective targeted support (formerly called Early Help) to achieve better outcomes for children and families through resolving problems before they become overwhelming and require high cost, reactive services.

## Our Offer

Children and young people between the ages of 6-13 years can be referred to the Playground by a range of partners but principally by schools and social care. Before any referrals are made, a visit to the playground to see what resources are available **will be required**. This will need to be agreed and arranged with the provider (be it school or social care services) and the Lead Playworker before any sessions are agreed and commence. The visit to the playground will provide an opportunity for the needs and outcomes of the intended referral to be discussed by the referring agency and a potential Playworker staff member to be allocated to take on the referred child and plan a bespoke programme. In the case that the child's needs are not suited to the allocated Playworker, this can be changed accordingly and agreed by all involved.

The playground holds their own generic risk assessment for one-to-one sessions however, a risk assessment for each referred child will need to be completed by the referring agency and sent back along with any completed referrals.

At present, we offer **one two-hour session per one child once a week**.

These sessions will be on set days and set times which will be indicated on the referral form for selection. Providers can access a maximum of **one term** (10 to 12 sessions, term-time only) which will be reviewed on conclusion and recommendations made to the provider moving forward.

If one or both parties feel that an extended term is required, this will require a re-referral however, this will be subject to availability as there may be a waiting list for other pending referrals which we may like to allocate first choice to.

Contrastingly, if we feel our intervention was not suited in achieving the desired outcomes for the child, we may recommend an alternative intervention from another provider if available.

Agreed referrals will be subject to staff capacity. All Playworker staff are committed to Continuous Professional Development, however there will be limitations as to what support can be given particularly if a child has many additional needs that require specialist support. In this case, this will be fed back to the provider and recommendations may be given. For any referral, any additional needs that a child has, such as emotional or behavioural challenges, will need to be listed on the referral form to ensure the right support is given and that our Playworker staff are competent to handle each child's needs.

Our Targeted Support Offer is reviewed regularly and can be reassessed to extend further support to referrals over the course of time.

In line with the Playwork Principles, we work with the 16 Play Types\* in our indoor and outdoor environments which enable us to provide the following:

### Policies and procedures

The Wisbech Adventure Playground is managed by Cambridgeshire County Council. We fully recognise our responsibility under section 175 of the Education Act 2002 to have arrangements in place to safeguard and promote the welfare of children. All playworkers have full CRB /DBS checks. Our full range of policies and procedure including Safeguarding and Child protection are available on request.

### Charges

The playground is an open access site which offers play provision for children and young people age 8-13 years. Children under the age of 8 years must be accompanied by a parent /carer over the age of 18 years. Playworkers are on site at set hours from Tuesday – Saturday.

### Charges for individual, group and family support are:

One to one playworker support - if a child is unaccompanied by an adult a second playworker will be required at an additional cost.	£40 per hour per playworker**

\*\* As of 1st September 2022, the price per hour per playworker will be increasing.
